- Participate in various Pro-Life activities to include the annual March for Life, donations to the Columbia Pregnancy Center, participating in our pastorate Living Rosary ceremony.
- + Help the Intellectually Challenged through the annual "Tootsie Roll" Program.
- Offer members life insurance via the Knights of Columbus Insurance Program.
- Presented rosaries to First Communicants and Confirmation candidates.
- Provide financial assistance to seminarians.
- Perform quarterly Road Clean Up outings along Rte. 216.
- Conduct annual Day of Reflection and Prayer at Saint Anthony's Shrine.
- Participated in Wreaths Across America
- Assist our parish with various needs and upkeep efforts.

What is the Knights of Columbus?

The Knights of Columbus is a dynamic Catholic, family, fraternal organization of Catholic men who join together in family, charitable, fraternal, community and youth activities. The over 2.0-million-member organization is international in character; however, the major emphasis is focused on the activities of our local parish and community. A major thrust of our activities is directed at involving the member's entire family.

Who is eligible for Membership?

Any man who is a practical Catholic, 18 years of age or older, may apply for membership in the Knights of Columbus. A practical Catholic is one who regularly practices his faith by going to Mass on Sunday, receiving the Sacraments, etc.

What is required of members?

Each member must be a practical Catholic and is required to pay annual dues, which can be paid either annually or quarterly. A new member can join online at www.kofc.org/join. The member must participate in a ceremony called exemplification to join the local council. The Exemplification will allow him to understand better, the principles of the Order (charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism) and how we, as Knights of Columbus, are expected to conduct ourselves.

Men who join the Knights of Columbus participate in council and State level programs, Pray with Brother Knights, attend meetings, participate in Council activities, serve on committees, or serve as an officer as their time permits and their interests dictate.

The rewards and satisfaction of membership in the Knights of Columbus are proportional to participation of each member and his family.

Why should you join the K of C?

Many brother Knights say that they joined to be a more effective Catholic; to be associated with and meet other Catholic men and their families; to make new friends; to strengthen their ties with the Catholic faith; to expand their community and social activities; to help others in a meaningful and organized way and thus achieve a truly unique sense of accomplishment.

As Catholics, we have an obligation to share our Faith, assist the less fortunate of our community, and support our parishes.

Many find that, as individuals, it is sometimes difficult to be involved in a significant way and balance the time constraints in our personal lives. As a Knight you and your family can share in the tremendous works of the Order without feeling the need to identify projects and organize your support all by yourself. In this way, your whole family can fulfill their obligations and feel satisfied that they are a part of more satisfying and worthwhile activities then they could possibly undertake as an individual. Each Council operates within four major program areas: Faith, Family, Community, and Life.


How often does our Council meet?
